Some more places names this time:

Ballynagard *Baile na gCeard*, 'town of the tradesmen'

Blackpark Road *Bóthar na Pairce Duibhe*. A direct translation.

Ballycastle *Baile an Chaistil* (note in this part of Antrim the word Caisteal instead of Caisleán is used (Except by Mac Quillans CLG, say no more!). This reflects a strong and proud local dialect which had as much in common with the Gaels of Scotland as it has with the rest Ireland, you could say we are the natural language bridge.

Cushleake *Cois Leice*, '(place) beside the flagstone'

Dalriada *Dál Riada*, name of the people or tribe from which the Gaelic population of this area and Scotland descend.

Glentop Road *Bóthar Bharr an Ghleanna* A direct translation.

Greenan(s) *Grianán*, 'sunny land, fort or hill'

Murlough *Murlag*, 'sea inlet', a development from ~Muirbolc,'sea-bag, i.e. lagoon,
